SAFER AT HOME

- 1,303 pets received life-saving veterinary care and pet supplies
- 469 families who lost their source of income due to the pandemic got the resources they needed to care for their pets
- **\$55,539 invested** back into Pinellas County small businesses through the fund

SAFER AT HOME was a targeted, short-term program that ran from May-December 2020 designed to help those in our community financially affected by COVID-19 care for their pets through the pandemic and ensuing economic recession. It gave families an alternative to the heartbreaking last resort of surrendering their beloved pet to a shelter.






